BROOKLYN RICKEY 10
Gin classic meets Manchester in Brooklyn.
Manchester Raspberry Infused Gin, lime juice, soda

ELIXIR LYNX 10.5
Name spin on the famous NY pornstar Alix Lynx and a long twist on a Pornstar Martini.
Smirnoff Vanilla, Passoa, passion fruit, orange juice, pineapple juice, Grenadine

VILLAGE SIDE FIZZ 10
Inspired by proximity to the famous gay village and the Southside Fizz cocktail.
Whitney Neill Rhubarb & Ginger Gin, vanilla, lemon juice, soda

BLOODY RUNYON'S 10.5
It was back in the 1920s when Fernand Petiot, an American bartender at Harry's New York Bar in Paris, mixed up equal parts of tomato juice and vodka. The patron said it reminded him of the Bucket of Blood Club in Chicago and called it Bloody Runyon's.
Smirnoff Red Label, Tabasco, Worcestershire Sauce, black pepper, Dow's Tawny Port, lemon, tomato juice, olive, celery, gherkin

MARY PICKFORD'S GRANDDAUGHTER 9.5
Inspired by a classic Prohibition era drink 'The Mary Pickford' merged with Piña Colada.
Malibu Coconut Rum, Ciroc Mango, pineapple juice, Coco Reál Cream of Coconut

LITTLE PINK 10
The Cardamom Rose Cocktail is a romantic cocktail made with a homemade rose simple syrup, fresh citrus, and bitters – it's got a gorgeous pink color!
Rose Tea Infused Smirnoff Red Label, Monkey 47 Sloe, Martini Bianco, lemon juice, Gomme, egg white

BLONDE MINK 10
Blonde mink was the fur of choice in the golden age of cinema, Greta Garbo in 1931's 'Inspiration' and Barbara Stanwyck in 1938's 'The Mad Miss Manton' are some iconic examples of the fur used in those golden days.
Disaronno Amaretto, Frangelico, Mozart Dark Chocolate, almond milk

BROOKLYN BRIDGE 10.5
The Brooklyn Bridge was invented in the 1980s at one of Keith McNally's New York City bars. It next appeared on the drinks menu at McNally's Balthazar in SoHo in 1996. The cocktail was produced during the 1980s–1990s cocktail renaissance.
SKYY Passion Fruit Vodka, Chambord, pineapple juice

GOLDEN APPLE 10
This drink, originally called an Adam's Apple because the bartender who created it was named Adam, was created in 1996 at Lola's West Hollywood restaurant.
Captain Morgan's Spiced Rum, Giffard Caramel Toffee, apple juice, lime juice, egg white

MARTINIS & FIZZ...

APEROL SPRITZ 10
The famous Italian aperitif, created in Padua in 1919 by the Barbieri brothers.
Aperol aperitif, Sette Bello Prosecco, Franklin's & Son's Soda Water

59 PORTLAND STREET – FIZZ 10.5
Hotel Brooklyn twist on the French 75.
Sipsmith Lemon Drizzle Gin, Gomme, Sette Bello Prosecco

MARSHA P JOHNSON – MARTINI 10.5
Famous gay rights activist, known as the Major of Christopher Street.
Ciroc Red Berry, Aperol, Martini Rosso, cranberry juice, lime juice, Gomme

MARGARITA 10.5
Created for gorgeous Ziegfeld showgirl Marjorie King, who was allergic to all forms of alcohol except tequila, but didn't like to drink the stuff straight.
Cointreau, Lime juice, Tequila

BROOKLYN HEIGHTS – FIZZ 9.5
Kir originated in Burgundy. It is named after the priest Canon Félix Kir, who was a hero in the French Resistance during the Second World War. Brooklyn Heights, differs in that it is made using sparkling wine.
Grenadine, Chambord, Sette Bello Prosecco

BROADWAY MIRACLE – FIZZ 10.5
The Broadway Miracle Cocktail is a drink of the United States, and is named for the Philadelphia Men's Club of the same name on South Broad Street.
SKYY Raspberry, cranberry juice, lime juice, Gomme, Sette Bello Prosecco

WHISKEY SOUR 11
A mixed drink containing whiskey (often bourbon). With a few bar spoons of full-bodied red wine floated on top, it is often referred to as a New York Sour. It is shaken and served either straight up or over ice.
Jack Daniels, lemon juice, lime juice, Gomme, Angostura Bitters, egg white

OLD FASHIONED 11
Made by muddling sugar with bitters, adding whiskey and garnishing with a twist of citrus rind. It is traditionally served in an old fashioned glass, which predated the cocktail.
Bulleit Bourbon, orange, brown sugar, Angostura Bitters

MOJITO 10
Havana, Cuba is the birthplace of the Mojito, although the exact origin of this classic cocktail is the subject of debate. It was known that the local South American Indians had remedies for various tropical illnesses, so a small boarding party went ashore on Cuba and came back with ingredients for an effective medicine.
Pampero Blanco Rum, lime juice, Gomme, mint, soda

ESPRESSO MARTINI 10
In cocktail terms, the Espresso Martini has a relatively short history with the drink believed to have been first created in the early eighties by London bartender Dick Bradsel, described at the time as the Cocktail King.
Smirnoff Vanilla Vodka, Tia Maria, espresso, Vanilla Gomme
